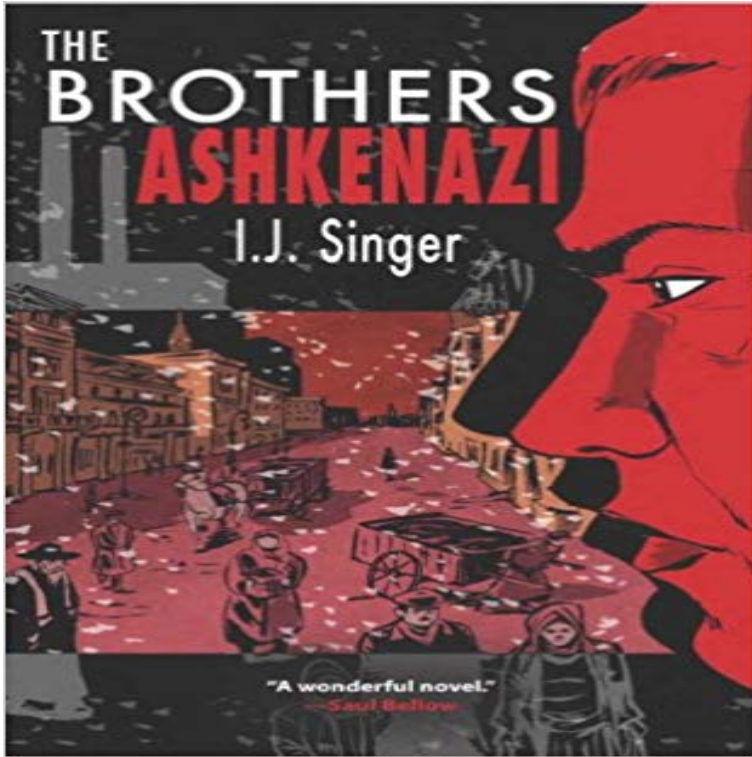


The Brothers Ashkenazi
