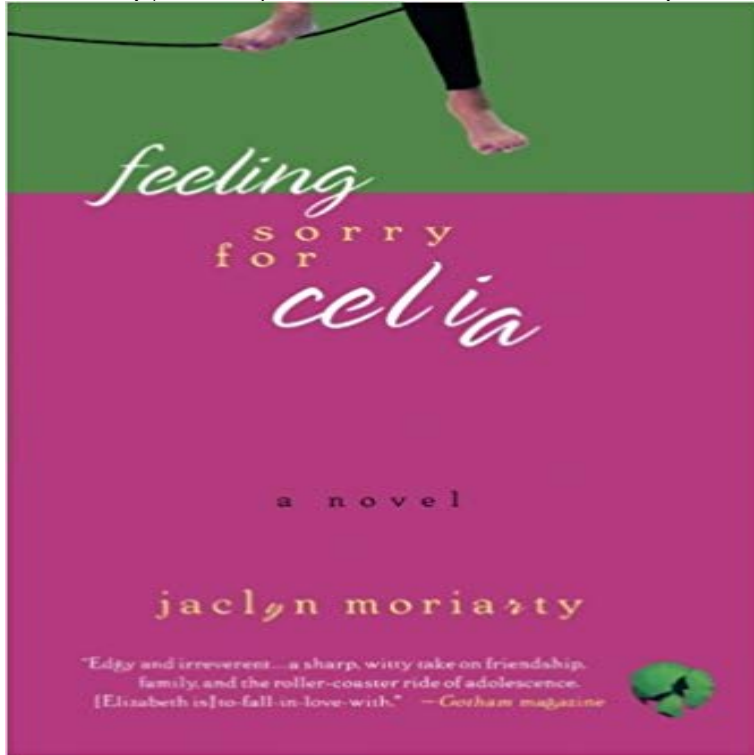


Feeling Sorry for Celia: A Novel (Ashbury/Brookfield Books)
