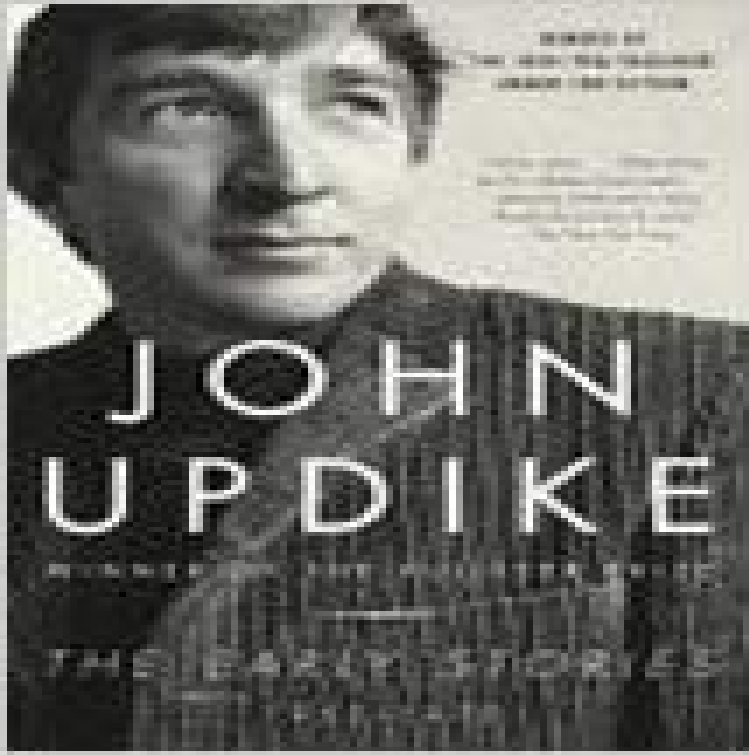


The Early Stories: 1953-1975
