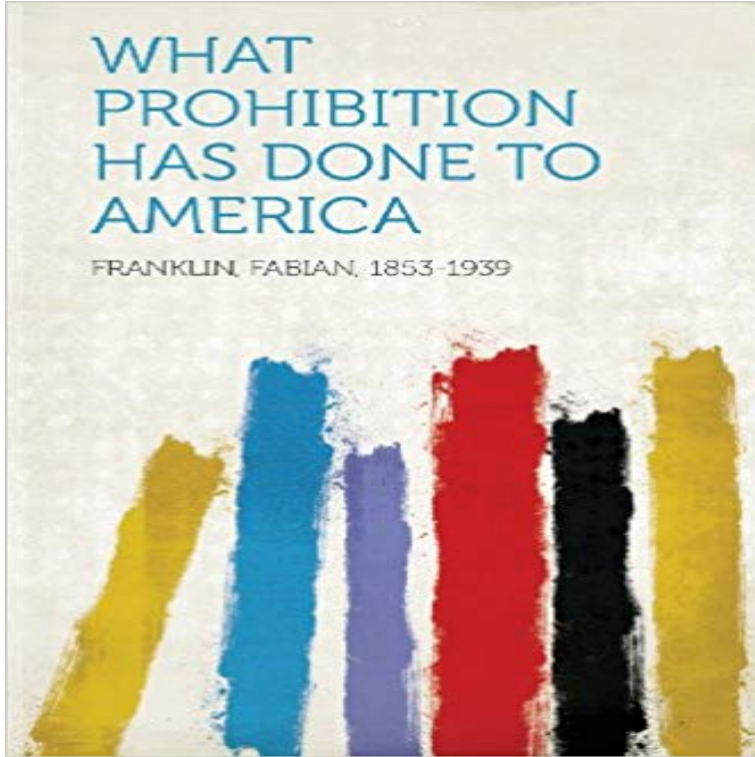


What Prohibition Has Done to America
